## GENE RONCONE

COVID is shaking the tree and what's falling to the ground is not good. Barna Research Group recently reported in their November 2021 newsletter that $38 \%$ of U.S. pastors have thought about quitting fulltime ministry in the past year. As a District Superintendent, that news is not shocking to me. In that same time period, I have assisted over three times the normal amount of churches experiencing a
pastoral transition. But what did surprise me about Barna's report is that younger ministers are struggling the most. Barna writes, "46 percent of pastors under the age of 45 say they are considering quitting fulltime ministry, compared to 34 percent of pastors 45 and older. Other significant differences arise among gender, with female pastors being far more likely than male pastors to have considered giving up full-time ministry." It would seem, that the uncertainties of a postCOVID ministry context, an increasingly divided church and improvisational fatigue has brought many younger leaders to tap out. Some would rather work a secular job than push through the uphill climb of rebuilding lost momentum in a post-COVID world.

Barna's findings concern me greatly. Not only because we
need our younger ministers, but because they need what the present can bring to their future. So, if you are one of those younger pastors struggling over whether to continue, move on or quit, let me encourage your soul with three reasons why we need you.

1. Trials mature parts of our character that success can't reach. The New Testament affirms this saying, "We also rejoice in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. And hope does not disappoint us, because God has poured out his love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom he has given us." (Romans 5:3-5) Unfortunately, the landscape of ministry expectations over the last several years has been largely defined by ministerial celebrity, wild growth and
leaders who are experiencing twice the measurable success at half the age of previous generations. But suffering, difficulty and disappointment, not large crowds and book deals is what matures our character. Hang on young friend, COVID is bringing something to your life that success is uncapable of delivering. Please don't leave before the package arrives.
2. Trials develop resiliency that any life you lead will demand. James waxes eloquent saying, "Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance." (James 1:2-3) Whether it's a secular job, your marriage, parenting or your own sense of purpose, any path you take will require perseverance. But there is no short cut or fast track to resiliency. It only comes through getting to the other side of quitting. Crisis teaches us to follow and trust God in the uncertain times. It gives us the patience to move forward and let the Holt Spirit fill in the blanks. It empowers you to grow, adjust and lean into the future God has for you. Perseverance is what enables you to thrive beyond the boundaries of your comfort zones, preferences, or infatuation with convenience. It is what enables you to serve
despite imperfect people and less than ideal contexts. It is what gave those listed in Hebrews 11 the capacity to live above the world of emotions, feelings, change and disappointment.
3. Trials nurture true greatness. They drag our faith out of the sterile laboratory of unrealistic expectations and drop them in the trenches of life. They teach us how to push through a miserable job, impossible situations and less than ideal circumstances. Simply said, it qualifies us for the future we're not ready for. Just ask Cy Young. Young is revered as perhaps the greatest pitcher of all time. One reason he was baseball's winningest pitcher was more because of his perseverance than ability. In Cy Young's day, there were no relief pitchers to bail a person out when the going got rough. That's right. There were no "closers," elaborate rotation plans, electric arm warmers or sports medicine gurus to lean on. Cy Young was a great pitcher because he had to hang in there and endure the "shelling." He had to pitch his way out of a jam. He was not born with that kind of perseverance, he had to develop it. That's how you and I develop character; when we must hang in there, stick to our values and trust that God will get us through. It is only during
those difficult and surrendering seasons of life that something supernatural is birthed in our spirits.

If you are reading this and are a younger minister, please listen to me. You may feel like quitting, but that temptation is from the darkest side of your nature not the best and brightest. It will only rob you of the only thing that can qualify you for the future you're not ready to reach. We need you! You are God's prophetic prescription for the future and all redemptive history has converged upon this one moment in time. You were born for this moment so please don't let discouragement rob you of your destiny. Pitch on, friend. Pitch on.

## BETTER TOGETHER PART I

RMMN churches pulling together to relaunch ministries adversely effected by covid.

COVID hit all of our churches hard, and some did not survive. However, God has touched the hearts of selfless East Slope Pastors to save two of those churches in Walsenburg and Gunnison. I asked Pastor Steve Chavez from Pueblo Praise to join me as I toured the Walsenburg facility and met the six remaining people. What God did in that meeting was amazing and I asked Pastor Steve to share the story about how God led him to revitalize and relaunch our work 45 minutes south of them in Walsenburg, Colorado. Here is this inspirational story as Steve tells it. In our next issue we will hear about the amazing things God is doing through an East Slope church helping to revitalize a West Slope church in Gunnison, Colorado.
"Dear Superintendent Roncone; Christmas greetings to you! During this season when we celebrate the Light of the World, I am writing to report the wonderful work being done in Walsenburg, Colorado. Jesus is broadening the light He casts using our church, and we are so excited and grateful to be a part of what He is doing! You brought to our attention that the Lighthouse Church in Walsenburg was losing their only pastor. There were only eight families in the church, and being in such a small town provided little hope for the future of the church. Where would another

pastor arise? There were no funds for a pastor, no availability of a part-time pastor, and no other resources. What would happen to their church? Would it dissolve? Where would the eight families go? Where do people go in that small community to find Jesus? I remember the day we went together to visit Walsenburg, see the church and the eight people who remained. It makes me smile, because God always leaves a remnant. Always. This was the remnant. As God does with His servants, He set several paths in front of us. We could let the church close; let someone else worry about it; or step in and link arms with them to help them move forward. With unified support and commitment, the pastoral staff and board of Praise Church Pueblo decided to step in! God left a remnant and we stepped in to adopt it as a second campus. It is now called, Praise Church Walsenburg. It reminds me of
the parable of the talents. God has given us resources which we can either bury or multiply. We chose to multiply, and it has been amazing to see how God works through His people! The pastoral team toured the Walsenburg building, and met with the outgoing pastor, Pastor Albert. We witnessed infrastructure, sound, plumbing, and other issues within the church building. Pastor Albert helped us understand the needs of the community and people. While he was being called away to another area, God blessed us with the opportunity to employ God's people to serve! I chose the words 'blessed us with the opportunity' because it truly is an opportunity serve God. Too often, the people we shepherd don't know when or how to step into their calling, and our job is to help them find it. It's truly a blessing and an opportunity. God called, gave the talents, and the church stepped forward
and multiplied! We developed a plan to employ a two-week rotation for pastors to preach and lead worship. This enabled the pastors and staff to not be away from their Pueblo Praise duties for too long, and all the staff would be able to meet the Walsenburg congregation. We didn't have a plan before we said yes. God provided the staff, structure, plan and flow after our yes. God was lifted up the very next Sunday; not one was missed. Pastor Danny preached and took a team of youth leaders with the youth worship team to lead worship. Pastor Jim took the following two weeks. He loaded up the 21-passenger shuttle, with a new worship team and twenty people from Pueblo, whose hearts were stirred by God. He was reaching His remnant by stirring the people from Pueblo Praise to reach for them too. While God was sending teams into the Walsenburg community, I continued to talk about the church in Walsenburg, and the people there who were waiting, and those who yet needed to see the light of Christ. I took my talent, used it, and watched God multiply more and send more people. Financial donations started coming in, and more people of Praise reached out to those in Walsenburg-whether it was door-to-door or people they knew. Their hearts were stirred for the remnant, and more was multiplied. Pastor Juanita stepped into Walsenburg next and took a team of women with her! God gifted Pastor Juanita with a desire to connect people together, and they redesigned the seating area.

More people were stirred to join in and create new pathways for brothers and sisters to connect with one another, as a true family. God also provided for the infrastructure; there is no detail He overlooks. Pastor Danny took a team to Walsenburg to clean up the worship center and sound system. A computer was donated, and on the very first week, the overhead projection and transparencies were upgraded to allow sermon slides and announcements. Pastor Juanita's son drew up designed plans to transform the platform area into a more welcoming area to pull people into God's heart through the word and worship. God sent donations to Pastor Steve for two large screen televisions that will replace the old dim projector. Praise sound and video tech will install the TVs. Even the outdoor sign is updated, and the voicemail and contact information and flow is updated. The children's rooms are being supplied with love and toys. The multiplication continues with an open house, to join people from Pueblo and Walsenburg Praise together as a family. Pastor Rob will be there next to bring his talents, and we will praise God, as we watch the way God multiplies again. The work will continue. The challenges will continue. And the joy will continue. I read a Facebook message from a Walsenburg church member that read, 'Today's sermon spoke directly to me in so many ways. I am still hearing the words in my head. God used Pastor Danny and his wife to awaken everything that been so quiet for
so long. I'm so happy for being a part of your church family'.

What if we would have turned away? What if we would have closed our eyes? What if we would have buried our talents? It makes me cringe to think of it. God is able. This past couple of years have been challenging and a struggle with unchartered waters and unsettling realities. As a church, we may be exhausted, frustrated, confused, and discouraged by the change in our ministries. But we must look up! God's light shines the brightest in the darkest of nights. And in this season where we celebrate the Light of the World, we remember that God is in complete control and is moving forward. His power and love are still reaching into our lives and into the darkness. He has left a remnant! He is breathing, moving, and multiplying. I can't wait to see what God will do next! Thank you for this opportunity, for helping us see this path, and for your faithful support."

As I read the RMMN
Connection I received on July 1, 2021, I became excited because I began to see how I could enlarge our leadership team educationally without losing them to go to Bible school. I became even more excited as we talked about it at Presbyters meeting in July.

I picked up several copies of the book EXPLORE THE CALL, by Gene Roncone before I left Colorado Springs. When I got home, I read it and became convinced that this was a way I could move us forward in leadership.

I registered for the Pathway to Credentials Zoom meeting on July 27th and became
more convinced that I was on the right track.

On August 1st, I preached a message titled, "I Didn't Know" from Genesis 28:1019. I began with a question of "where does God dwell," using Isaiah 15:15 as the answer being "I dwell in the high and holy place with him who has a contrite and humble spirit, to revive the spirit of the humble and to revive the heart of the contrite ones."

Many individuals are not in active ministry or leadership roles because they have become discouraged or put down when they express to others a desire for ministry, even by their pastors. Others are never offered the opportunity to explore through experience in ministry.

At the end of the message, I shared a bit of this opportunity and then met individually and gave the book to 7 people who expressed interest. We then met as a group on September $23 r d$. Several of them had already read the whole book and came primed with questions.

We are now scheduled to meet Sunday evenings every
other week to get more in depth in the discussion questions. Some are looking at the Pathways option and some are looking at the Trinity online option. The group is absolutely delighted for the opportunities ahead.

I encourage you as pastors to present this to your congregation. I think you will be surprised at the interest.

## 2022 CTC SCHOOL OF PASTORAL MINISTRY ROSTER

Today Superintendent Gene Roncone announced those selected for the 2022 Charles T. Crabtree School of Pastoral Ministry. The school was created to prepare the next generation of lead pastors for excellence in ministry. District Superintendent Gene Roncone and Charles Crabtree teamed up to share wisdom that has been passed down through five generations of ministers in their family. This mentorship first existed as a notebook Crabtree wrote to help those in his family prepare for their first lead pastorate. Now it has been redesigned as a 15-week leadership cohort to prepare qualified associates for the modern demands of serving as a lead pastor. After Crabtree's death Superintendent Roncone invited Church Ministries Director Shawn Reine to join the mentoring team. Participants will learn...

- How to develop a life-giving devotional life
- How to know if you're ready for a lead pastorate
- How to explore God's will and interview with a search committee
- How to navigate your first

- Principles and dynamics of church administration
- How to develop office routines
- Budgets and church finances
- How to lead board and annual business meetings

- How to know the role of a minister's spouse
- Ministerial ethics, etiquette and protocol
- Pastoral care, hospital visitation and pastoral counseling
- How to pastor expressions of the spiritual gifts

The cohort will consist of weekly group Zoom meetings with Superintendent Gene Roncone and other members of the cohort, individual assignments, discussion huddles with their lead pastor and potential preaching assignments throughout the Rocky Mountain Ministry Network. ## GO RURAL, PART 5: SUBSIDIZING RURAL WARRIORS



Over the years, most of our rural church closures were in communities that could not provide sufficient employment opportunities for bivocational pastors. Other times, rural churches were unable to provide a suitable salary for a younger pastor with a family. More often than not, these churches become overly dependent on older ministers who already have retirement incomes but may also have health challenges.

There are several reasons why we must begin helping our rural pastors realize subsidized income from outside their local contexts. Let me mention just a few.

1. Maintain a gospel presence. Many of our rural churches are the only gospel and/or Spirit-filled witnesses in their communities.
2. Subsidize income. Provide a way to partner with the family and friends of rural pastors to subsidize their income on a monthly basis.
3. Increase longevity. Increase the likelihood and longevity of quality leadership in our rural communities.
4. Lighten the burden. Decrease stress, discouragement, and burnout due to excessive bivocational demands. Having two jobs is doable, but counting their church job, many rural pastors have three.
5. Foster dignity. Provide the opportunity for rural pastors to have dignity and value in being able to adequately provide for their families.
6. Embrace culture. With nearly 40 percent of our RMMN
churches being rural in nature, this strategy would help us embrace the rural culture and geographic obstacles of our Network.
7. Support churches. Assist churches that cannot presently support a lead pastor with a fulltime salary.

To better sustain our gospel presence in Colorado and Utah's rural communities, we must assist our ministers, both young and old, by connecting them to financial partners who can subsidize their income.

## HEAD OF THE TABLE
