



25 ways to serve your campus

MEET THE PRINCIPAL

Even if you have nothing to offer at this time, stop by or make an appointment to introduce yourself. If you already know ways you can volunteer, offer those ideas.

CONNECT WITH SCHOOL COUNSELORS

If you have troubled students in your youth group, connecting with a school counselor is a great way of building a safety net under that student while working together.

BE PRESENT AT SCHOOL EVENTS

The school personnel will get to know you and the students will start to recognize you.

DISCOVER A NEED AND FILL IT

- Go to a school board meeting and listen.
- Ask others about school needs ie: help with baccalaureate, provide sound, video and lights, etc. for graduation, painting a classroom

11 COLLECT SCHOOL SUPPLIES

Coordinate with the school to deliver backpacks and school supplies to under served students.

TWELVE FILL LUNCH BAGS

Fill backpacks/bags with food for weekend meals. Make sure to coordinate with the school.

HONOR A SPECIFIC SCHOOL AT YOUR YOUTH GROUP

Each quarter, have a gift, scholarship or donation of equipment for the school.

FIVE VOLUNTEER TO COACH A TEAM

- SUBSTITUTE TEACH
- SERVE IN THE LUNCHROOM Contact the school for ways you can serve in the lunchroom. This creates both trust and favor.
- 8 OFFER YOUR CHURCH BUILDING FOR SPECIAL DISTRICT EVENTS
- BRING GIFTS TO OFFICE STAFF Consider bringing gift cards, fresh coffee, or gift certificates to local businesses.
- HELP WITH CAMPUS GROUPS
 Assist student leaders, attend their events and offer to speak when needed.

- GIVE A WELCOME CARD AND GIFT CARD TO TEACHERS

Host at your church with a catered meal, gifts, awards, etc. Make it easy to attend during the week.

BRING IN SCHOOL ASSEMBLY SPEAKER AND PAY FOR IT
